In April 1861, President Lincoln issued a call for 75,000 volunteers to put down the rebellion of the southern states. One of the regiments answering that call was the 28th NY Volunteer Infantry. At places known as Winchester, Antietam, Chancellorsville and Cedar Mountain these men bravely faced some of the best troops in the Confederacy, including the legendary “Stonewall Brigade”.

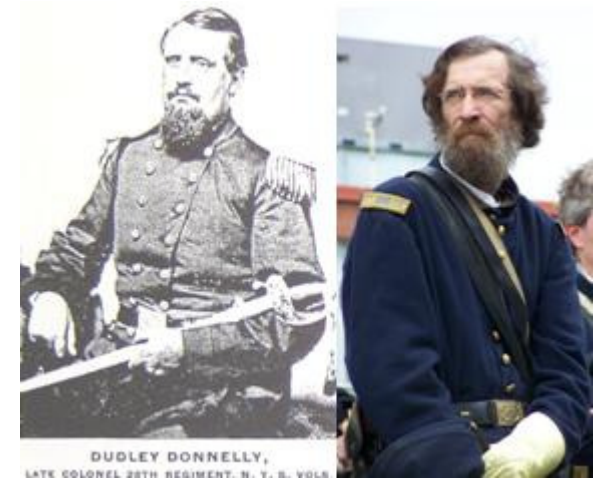
